Saturday April 18– All First Feis through Prizewinner Solos & Trophy Specials (Reel/Treble Jig, Slip Jig, Treble Reel), Teams, Adults, Additional Blackout Preliminary and Open Championships

Sunday April 19 – Blackout Beg/Adv-Beg and Treble Jig Trophy, Preliminary and Regular Open Championships and Championship Specials (Slip Jig, Treble Reel), Minor, Junior, Senior Belt Championship Dance-Off, Madonna Nixon Memorial Slip Jig Cup, and Joel Hanna Boys Perpetual Cup.

Championships using Option B Preliminary dancers, as well as Open, dance the full three rounds and individual solo medals will be awarded for each dance.

EIDA Spring “Feis in the West” Championship Specials – Slip Jig and Treble Reel

Madonna Nixon Memorial Slip Jig Cup

First place winners in the Championship Slip Jig specials perform one step down the line.

The “Best in the West” Perpetual Belts

3 age groups (Minor- Under 13, Junior - Under 16, Senior- 16 and Over). The Winners from both Preliminary and Open Championships in each age group qualify to dance – one soft shoe and one hard shoe step down the line.

The “Joel Hanna” Perpetual Cup Championship Special for Boys

All boys who dance in championships qualify to dance - one hard shoe, one soft shoe. Joel Hanna is one of the most successful male dancers to originate from Western Canada. Joel's many accomplishments include winning 3 North American Championships, 1 Australian National Championship and the North American Feis Commission (NAFC) Senior Belt.

Perpetual Trophies for Regular Reel and Treble Jig Trophy, Slip Jig Specials and Regular Championships

Provided for Regular Championships and Reel, Treble Jig, and Slip Jig Trophy competitions, including Perpetual Belts for the “Best in the West” Minor, Junior, and Senior Belt championship specials plus a Perpetual Cup for the “Joel Hanna” Boys Championship, and a Perpetual for the Madonna Nixon Memorial Slip Jig Cup.

Additional Blackout Competitions

Beg/Adv-Beg Reel Trophy, Nov-PW Treble Jig Trophy, Preliminary and Open Championships – dancers must wear a black t-shirt, black skirt or black dress with black tights or poodle socks (ladies) or black t-shirt, and black trousers (gents). No logos or markings allowed. Wigs optional. New CLRG rule - When wearing body suits with skirts (commonly known as black-out attire) black tights (of a denier no less than 70) must be worn from the age of 14 and above. Effective date: 1st February, 2020

Sashes

Provided Preliminary and Open Championships 1st, 2nd, 3rd place.

Music, Art, and fun Parent-Child Competitions

Music competitions will be held Sunday. Art theme is anything Celtic. Art judging will be on Saturday afternoon, with prizes available to be picked up with the art piece Saturday at the end of day. The parent-child competition will be held during teams on Saturday. The team can be any dance, with any number of team members (2, 4 etc.). Dancers and their relatives (mom, dad, aunt, grandparents, etc.) can be from the same or different schools. Feis Rules

1. Competitions are open only to amateurs. Only students of teachers registered in good standing with The W.C.I.D.T.A., The I.D.T.A.N.A., and An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha may compete.
2. Competitor's ages will be determined as of January 1, 2020.
3. Entry forms are to be checked and signed by the registering teacher.
4. Music shall be in accordance with regulation metronome speeds.

5. Categories:

- First Feis: A dancer who has never previously competed in a registered competition.
- Beginner: A dancer who has not qualified for Advanced Beginner in that particular dance.
- Adv Beginner A dancer who has received a qualifying place in that particular dance in the beginner level, but has not yet qualified to move on to Novice in that particular dance.
- Novice: A dancer who has received a qualifying place in that particular dance in the Adv. Beginner level, but has not yet qualified to move on to PW for that particular dance.
- Prizewinner: A dancer who has received a qualifying place in that particular dance in the Novice level, but has not yet qualified to advance to Preliminary Championships.

Beginner/Advanced Beginner Trophy: (Reel, 32 bars)

Open to dancers who dance the majority of their dances in the Beginner or Advanced Beginner level in solos. A dancer must advance to Novice/Prizewinner Trophy if they receive two first place Trophies in this level, or if they advance in their solo levels.

Novice/Prizewinner Trophy: (Treble Jig, 32 bars, choice of 2 speeds)

Open to dancers who dance the majority of their dances in the Novice or Prizewinner level in solos. Also open to dancers who have previously won two first place trophies in the Beginner/Advanced Beginner Trophy competitions. Dancers in ALL age groups will dance the Treble Jig (as per 05/31/02).

Preliminary Championships: Open to dancers who have won two first place trophies in the Novice/Prizewinner Trophy competition, and who have not previously won two first place

Preliminary Championships. This feis will be Option B – (at the Feis Committee's discretion) one soft shoe round AND one hard shoe round AND one Non-Traditional Set Dance may be danced, in which case, the Feis Committee would offer this trophy dance instead of Preliminary solos (as per 05/31/02). Solo marks will be given for each round, and an overall Championship prize will be awarded.

Open Championships: Open to dancers who have previously won two first place Prelim Championships.

6. Dancers may only dance each dance once, the exception being dancers who are entered in First Feis competitions, who may also dance in Beginner for those dances.
7. In Figure dancing, 50% of a team may be moved to a higher age group to complete a figure, unless the Feis Committee has granted special permission. All Ceili dances must be performed in accordance with the Official Book "An Rince Foirne".
8. A competition may be cancelled or combined with a higher age group if there are less than five entries. If there is a large entry, the competitions will be split.
9. Dancers should be in the hall 60 minutes before scheduled time of their competition.

10. All dancers must be in costume, complete with shoes and number to receive any award onstage.
12. Under no circumstances are the adjudicators or the musicians to be approached during the feis. The decision of the adjudicator is final.
12. No steel taps or bubble heels allowed. Shoes may be subject to inspection by adjudicators. Costumes must be in accordance with the I.D.T.A.N.A. and An Coimisiun guidelines.
13. The Feis in the West Committee, the W.C.I.D.T.A. and its parent bodies, and the venue, are not responsible for personal injury, property loss or damage during an event.
14. Protest against breach of rules will be considered if made in writing and signed by the objector. The objection must also be accompanied with a \$25.00 fee and reach the Feis in the West Committee before prizes are presented. If the complaint is justified, the \$25.00 fee will be refunded.
15. Competitors may only compete in the Trophy competition or a Championship, but not both. 'Specials (competitions numbered in the 1000's) do not apply in this case.
16. No video equipment shall be allowed in the hall, including digital recording devices. This is a Commission rule.
17. The EIDA Spring "Feis in the West" Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
18. Dancers shall advance in each individual solo dance as follows:
Number of Dancers in the Competition Placing(s) that move dancer(s) to the next level

Number of Dancers in the Competition	Placing(s) that move dancer(s) to the next level
<5	no placing advances
5 – 9	1st place moves up
10 – 19	1st, 2nd, 3rd move up
20 – 29	1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th move up
30 or more	1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th move up

19. Dancers shall advance in Trophy competitions and Championship as follows:
- A dancer who wins two first place trophies in Beginner/Advanced Beginner Trophy advances to Novice/Prizewinner Trophy
 - A dancer who advances to Novice or Prizewinner for the majority of their solo levels (hard shoes in particular) automatically advances to the Novice/Prizewinner Trophy.
 - A dancer who wins two first place trophies in Novice/Prizewinner Trophy advances to Preliminary Championships.
 - A dancer who wins two first place Prelim Championships advances to Open Championships.
20. Feis Committees must award a minimum of 30% of competitors in Prelim and Open Championships.
21. Shiny plastic number cards should not be used.
22. All other Feis rules as per the N.A.F.C., An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha, the I.D.T.A.N.A. and the W.C.I.D.T.A.
