Dancing order will be randomly determined. One adjudicator's marks will determine solo competition results for each round. Treble reel danced one step down the line.

Western US Region Advancement Rules

FIRST FEIS: Open to dancers participating in their first feis ever; allowed only once in their dancing career.

GRADES: Beginners, Advanced Beginners and Novices: 5-9 dancers, $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ place advances; 10+ dancers, $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ & $\mathbf{2}^{\text{nd}}$ place advance; in the case of backto-back feiseanna, advancement on the second day is optional. Prizewinners advance at teacher's discretion.

CHAMPIONSHIPS: Preliminary Champions *immediately* advance to Open Championships (even in the case of back-to-back feiseanna) after placing 1st in three preliminary championships with at least 5 competitors.

ADULTS: Adult competitions are open to dancers 18 and over not having danced in grades or championships for a minimum of 5 years.

ADVANCED ADULTS: An Advanced Adult dancer is defined as anyone age 18 or older who has previously placed in the top 3 of a Preliminary Championship or competed at the Open Championship level in the youth/& over levels, regardless of when the competitor was last active.

- Advanced Adults do not need to be out of competition for 5 years before moving from the youth/& over categories to Advanced Adults.
- Dancers who have already been competing in the regular Adult categories do not need to move to Advanced Adults, regardless of their level or placements achieved when competing in youth/& over.

An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave Youth/& over categories, and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to Youth/& over categories.

Competition Rules

- 1. Rules adopted by the Western US Region of IDTANA, member CLRG, are included by reference.
- 2. Rules and requirements for each competition as noted in the syllabus are included by reference.
- 3. Competitors must be in the hall prepared to dance one hour prior to the scheduled start of their event.
- 4. Competitions with fewer than five entrants may be combined or canceled by the Feis Committee; the Feis Committee may add or combine competitions at its discretion.
- 5. Competitors must be in costume, including soft shoes, to receive awards presented from stage.
- 6. An Daire Academy of Irish Dance, Pacific Celtic Foundation, the Feis Committee, the venuel, and anyone associated in producing the feis, including feis volunteers, shall not be held responsible or liable for any personal injury, property loss, or damage.
- 7. Entry constitutes acceptance of the rules and restrictions outlined herein.

Western U.S. Region Level Definitions & Advancement

- 1. First Feis is not per dance, but the first feis ever for the dancer. Only one first feis regardless of how many dances they are doing. Dancers may only enter First Feis once, even in case of back-to-back feiseanna.
- 2. In Beginner, Advanced Beginner, and Novice the following will apply: 5 9 dancers: 1st place will advance to the next grade; 10 or more dancers: 1st and 2nd places will advance to the next grade. Dancers may NOT stay in level at Teacher discretion.
- 3. Prizewinner: Advancement from Prizewinner to Preliminary Championship is at teacher discretion.
- 4. Preliminary to Open Championship: Must have 3 overall wins with 5 or more dancers, not at teacher discretion. Upon winning their 3rd overall win in Preliminary Championships, a dancer must move immediately to Open, even in the case of back-to-back feiseanna.
- 5. Adults: Dancers who started after the age of 18 or have not competed for 5 years.
- 6. Advanced Adults: An Advanced Adult dancer is defined as anyone age 18 or older who has previously placed in the top 3 of a Preliminary Championship or competed at the Open Championship level in the youth/& over levels, regardless of when the competitor was last active.
 - Advanced Adults do not need to be out of competition for 5 years before moving from the youth/& over categories to Advanced Adults.
 - Dancers who have already been competing in the regular Adult categories do not need to move to Advanced Adults, regardless of their level or placements achieved when competing in youth/& over.

An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave Youth/& over categories, and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to Youth/& over categories.

7. Dancers residing outside the Western U.S. Region should consult the rules for advancement within the region in which they reside.
