

LEVEL ADVANCEMENT AND DEFINITION

First Feis is not per dance, it is the first Feis ever for the dancer. Only one first feis regardless of how many dances they are doing. Dancers may only enter First Feis once even in case of back-to-back Feiseanna.

In B1, B2 and Novice the following will apply:

3 round Preliminary Championships.

5 - 9 dancers 1st place will advance to the next grade

10 or more dancers 1st and 2nd places will advance to the next grade

Dancers may not stay in level at Teacher discretion, with the exception of back to back feiseanna

Prizewinner: Advancement from Prizewinner to Preliminary Championship is at teacher discretion.

Preliminary to Open Championship: Must have 3 overall wins with 5 or more dancers, not at teacher discretion. Upon winning 3rd overall win in Preliminary Championships, a dancer must move immediately to Open, even in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna. This includes 2 round and

Adults: Dancers who stared after the age of 18 or have been out of competitions for 5 years.

Beginner Figures: Open only to dancers in beginner for at least one solo dance.

Solo Competitions

*In order to move up in a dance, a minimum of 5 dancers must have danced in that competition.

*Competitions with 4 entries or less may be combined.

Christine O'Riada Team Silly Sock Special

Christine O'Riada was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland and grew up doing Irish Dance and Ballet. She attended a ballet boarding school and from there became a professional dancer, model, and was involved in theatre. She came over to the states as a dancer with The Brendan Boyer Royal Show Band who had successful funs in Reno/Tahoe and Vegas. From there she landed in Kansas City. While she did quite a bit of traveling, Kansas City became her home base and she was there until 2010, when she moved back to Belfast until her passing in April of 2013. Her passion was performance and she always aimed for the O'Riada Academy displays to be more like a show you would see in a theatre. She loved coming up with fun routines as well as taking "normal" dances like St. Patrick's Day and showing them off in unexpected and modern ways. She championed her students creativity and encouraged them to become involved in and a part of the choreography. Treble reel started with "the school step" and after that, students were given the reigns. We know that, even in her passing, seeing dancers come together and come up with something fun that they are proud and excited to perform, would be the best way to honor her. We are taking a break from the "show" routines on our 5th year of our feis to give more dancers an opportunity to get their start in the creative process and to participate in something she would have loved. She also was known for her fun socks and the feis she founded in Kansas City still honors her with silly sock treble reels. So our take on this will be either soft shoe or hard or a mix of both. Be as creative as you want to be in 16 bars of music in reel time. You must have at least 2 in your group. Creativity and fun is what counts here and all levels are welcome to participate. While one group (school) will take this memorial cup home and will get to add their school's name to the cup, we want you to think of this as more of a show than a competition.

Groups 2+ come out and do 16 bars down the line to fun music in reel time. Be creative with the socks and even outfits if you want to suit your theme. Can be hard or soft shoe. Have fun with the choreography! Does not need to be championship choreography to have a chance to win so please don't let the "all levels" scare you.

Winners win the Christine O'Riada memorial cup and get to keep it for a year as well as add their school's name to the cup.
