General Information: Grade exams are a progressive system of non-competitive evaluation. They are intended to offer the dancer a thorough assessment of their knowledge and technique at each level of their dance education.

Candidates will spend approximately 30 minutes completing each grade. Final schedule will be published by Friday, June 19.

Exam Fees

Grades 1-3 \$26.25/grade

Grades 4-6 \$37.50/grade

Grades 7-10 \$52.50/grade

What to wear:

No costumes. Generic practice attire or all-black ensemble. No school logos, insignias, or other identifiers. No wigs or hair accessories.

What to dance:

Dancers should be prepared to perform steps* appropriate to the Grade level ...

- Beginner steps for 'Easy' dances
- Traditional steps for 'Basic' dances
- Novice steps for 'Primary' dances
- Prizewinner or Championship steps for 'Advanced' dances

Eligibility:

Dancers attempting Grade 2 or higher must present official certificates from past Grade Exams as proof of eligibility. Dancers registered for multiple Grade Exams (i.e.: Grades 1, 2 and 3) will be required to successfully pass each initial grade before attempting the next. Dancers should request permission from their TCRG before registering as a candidate.

Spectators are not allowed in the preparation area or examination room.

Note: St. Patrick's Day, Blackbird, Job of Journeywork, Garden of Daisies, King of the Fairies, Three Sea Captains and Jockey to the Fair must be performed in a traditional manner. 40 bars of music must be danced for all Reels, Single or Hop Jigs, Light Jigs, Slip Jigs, Heavy Jigs and Hornpipes. Music speeds as per CLRG rules.
